Heroes of the Vosges Museum Grand Opening, Bruyères France

On October 18, 2024, just prior to the 80th Anniversary celebration of the Liberation of Bruyères, Mayor Denis Masy and Carl Williams cut the ribbon on the temporary museum in honor of the 100th/442nd Regimental Combat Team and the French Resistance who aided them.



The Nisei Museum has borrowed limited space in the Henri Mathieu Musee, a historic building that once was a Jewish synagogue. We thank the town of Bruyères and all those who have contributed to this first step and look forward to moving to the final phase -- the permanent site which is now being considered by the Mayor and City Council. A special thanks to all those who contributed artifacts which were shipped by air to France as part of 54 cartons.

Our daughter, Mariko Williams, is largely responsible for the artistic work that resulted in the museum's layout, a layout that follows the Nisei story from Pearl Harbor to ultimate

victory and the incredible number of medals and honors -- including the 21 Medals of Honor earned by Americans of Japanese descent. Former Mayor Yves Bonjean, using his personal tools and skills, worked with us throughout the preparation and did a great deal to make the opening a success.

The image depicts the work in progress and in the left side of the photo shows the portion of the exhibition in honor of the French Resistance. Note the relief map at the lower right of the image and the campaign map behind the mannequin in 442nd RCT uniform. French re-enactors help accurately dress the mannequin with both original and replica 442nd RCT combat uniform. All displays were in both French and English.

This scholarship is open to all high school seniors, undergraduate, and graduate students. Students interested in applying to this scholarship should be prepared to engage in a critical reflection in relation to community and service.

NVC Foundation *Okagesama de* **Scholarship**

Okagesama de in Japanese means, "I am what I am because of you". The unconstitutional incarceration of Japanese Americans during World War II inspires the mission of the NVC Foundation (NVCF): "Honor the past and educate the future". By "honoring the past" or remembering our ancestors who faced discrimination based on race and hysteria, our goal is to "educate the future".

This scholarship is open to all high school seniors, undergraduate, and graduate students pursuing a degree at a community, technical, or 4-year university in Washington State. Students interested in applying to this scholarship should be prepared to demonstrate a critical reflection in relation to this theme or traditional saying.

Completed applications and all supporting documents must be submitted by Saturday, February 22, 2025, by 11:59 p.m. PST.

Mark Shigihara Memorial Scholarship

Amount: \$2,000

Scholarships Awarded: 1

The Mark Shigihara Memorial Scholarship commemorates a Seattle sansei who prioritized the joy and wellness of his family and community. Shigihara's educational and inspirational memoir, *Living Lessons - My Journey of Faith, Love, and Cutting-edge Cancer Therapy,* was shared to "...help others who face life-altering challenges". His professional career spanned leadership roles as a clinical pharmacist, specialist in the pharmaceutical industry, and as an affiliate associate professor with the University of Washington and Washington State University Schools of Pharmacy.

Mark's father, Ken Shigihara, and father-in-law, Ken Sato, served in the U.S. Army Military Intelligence Service. His uncle, Tom Ohtani, served in the U.S. Navy. Mark's family members continue their generational support of the Seattle Nisei Veterans Committee.

Scholarship eligibility applies to students who are currently enrolled in the University of Washington School of Pharmacy.



Obituary

Toshiko Akagi Okamoto

August 16, 1923 - October 27, 2024

Toshiko passed away peacefully at Nikkei Manor in Seattle, WA, at age 101. She was predeceased by Tosh, her beloved husband of 68 years, her parents Sadako and Tokio Akagi, and sisters Masako and Michiko.

She is survived by her sister Kachi; her four children Joyce, Susan, John and Sheila; her nine grandchildren; and her nine+ great-grandchildren. She actively supported them in hundreds of activities. She loved hosting and celebrating gatherings with the large extended family.

Toshiko ("Toshi") was born and raised in Seattle. During her senior year at Broadway High School in 1942, she, her family, and her community were forced by the US government to leave their homes. They were incarcerated, initially held at the Puyallup Fairgrounds ("Camp Harmony") and then moved to the Minidoka Incarceration Camp in Idaho. Toshi returned to Seattle following World War II, and worked as a medical secretary at Providence Hospital, then became a school secretary at Seward Elementary.

She and Tosh owned and managed several apartment buildings. Always ready for new adventures, Toshi took up skiing and golfing after retirement. She also enjoyed fishing, mushroom picking, hiking, clam digging, traveling, and hosting family and community gatherings. Tosh was a founding member of "Issei/Nikkei Concerns" which included Keiro Nursing Home, Ayame Kai Guild, Nikkei Manor Assisted Living, and Kokoro Kai Day Program, and Toshi was an enthusiastic supporter.

One of Toshi's many volunteer activities was leading and organizing the baking and selling of hundreds of delicious homemade apple pies for an annual Ayame Kai fundraising event - an event that she was "planning" even on her last days. On her final Monday, she participated in Nikkei Manor's daily exercise class, won at Bingo, and was proud and happy to cast her ballot for "Pamela" Harris for President of the United States.

The family especially appreciates the attentive and loving care provided by caregivers from Day By Day Nursing Care and Nikkei Manor staff.

Olympia Chapter JACL Oshogatsu & Lunar New Year Celebration


